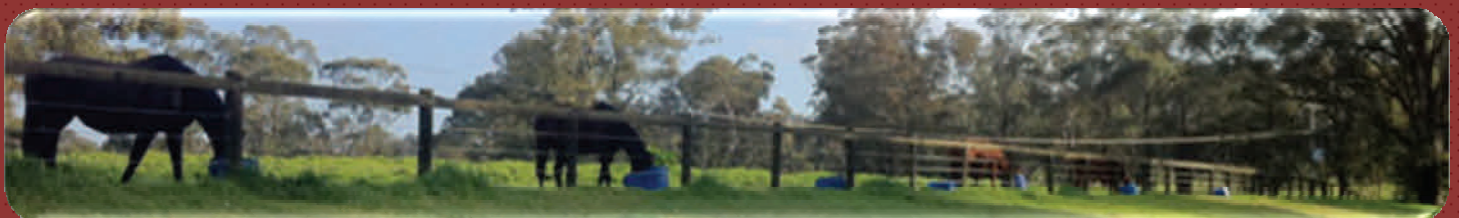
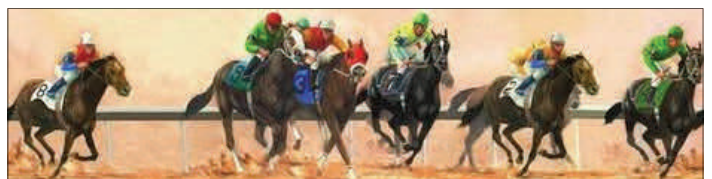
Shares are still available for this lovely colt by Trotamondo

Thank you to all that braved the rain and the cold to attend our open days. I think I should have a serious talk to the open day Gods, about our luck in choosing the right day weather wise!

I begin the news of the past month, with our first runner at Warwick farm on the 2nd of June. SHADES OF GREEN, we thought, maybe she'd had enough, as she'd been up and raced seven times this prep, including two wins. Quite enough for a slight little filly, however, she showed us otherwise and ran a bottler. Wide all the way from an outside barrier, she fought out the finish to be beaten only half a length to run fifth. Apprentice Shaun Guymer stated the obvious, "draws a barrier she wins".

Finally her system said "time for a holiday", when the only excuse at Newcastle on the 19th was, a not a good track. We have kept her warm rug on, whilst out spelling in the paddock, along with two very confused babies asking "does that thing grow on you when you get older?"

Off we trotted to Royal Bathurst on the 12th, with BLACK PIRATE; I hope you find the pun amusing below his photo. Honestly, the only reason we raced him, apart from him being the only three year old in the race, plus lugging a hefty 60-1/2 kgs, was one reason, THE TRACK. As we know PIRATE, at this stage on wet tracks, feels the ground shift under his enormous stride; this must give him the feeling of actually doing the splits. Perhaps that's why they would never run Black Caviar on a wet track; they knew the odds were against her handling it, with such an enormous stride. We couldn't be happier with AUSBRED BENZ; he's maturing into a magnificent horse. Being the final and last foal out of the wonder mare Stormy Zephyr, he should do his siblings proud, AUSBRED KING and AUSBRED BLUE to name only two.

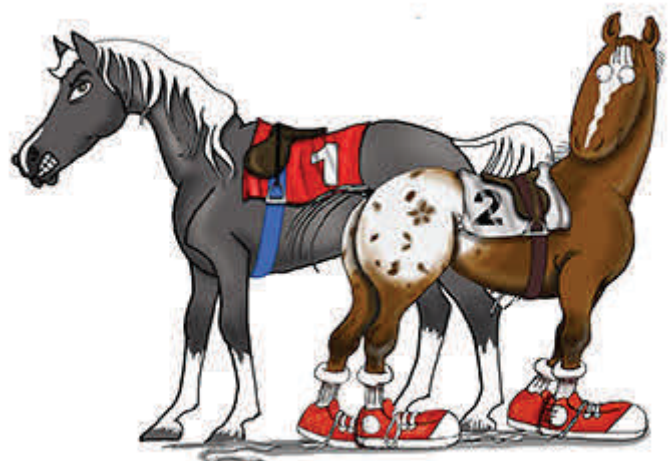


Chris and Lyn Lawlor having a ball at Ascot, Go Aussie!!

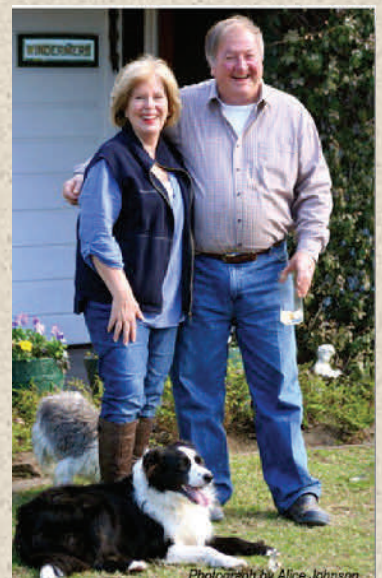

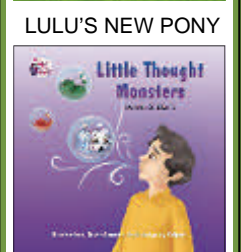
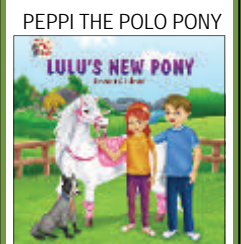
The deal with the Chinese publishers is they want five more stories on top of my five already published stories, to put in a hard cover book containing ten stories.
