We had only a few horses to grace the tracks this month; the first race meeting we attended was at Bathurst on the first of July.

SNIPAROSE looked the winner at the final fifty meters of the race, which was run on a very even surface; reading a heavy ten. IF she had of drawn a barrier and the race had not been extended a further six meters, she wins for sure. She ran 4th and was beaten a head from the winner!!

Newcastle on the 12th was our next port of call.

TOO CHIC had her first go over 1600mts and ran an unlucky 3rd in a stop start affair.

LA CHIC while still green seemed to understand a little more of what it's all about, she ended up not too far away from the winner.

SNIPAROSE was in company with at least half the runners on the day, in feeling the hard as concrete track. She took some days to recover and has only just recently picked up to be one hundred percent. SNIP will be nominated for Hawkesbury on the 7th and also at Bathurst on the 11th. We have---and she has--- tried so hard to win a bobs race; she has come so very close to it three times this prep. Unfortunately, after the Newcastle run, we had to give up the chase and let her tell us when she will be ready to race again. Wade of course will be guided by the noms for each of the above races at Bathurst or Hawkesbury.

SACRED JOURNEY was freshened up for Wyong on the 17th. He was able to get cover in running, but still over raced, due to the slow pace put on by the leader; it of course turned into a sprint home. I get a little tired of saying this horse has an ongoing pelvic problem, which he suffers with badly if he pulls in a race. So, all I will say is; after that race, his chiropractor had to re-adjust him again. SACRED will have a crack at winning another 1800mt race at Hawkesbury on the 7th/8.

On the 22nd TOO CHIC raced at Golbourn in the slowest ever run mile on a fast track! It should now go into the Guinness Book of records-nearly 1.41 they clocked!! I could have run beside them! This of course does not suit CHIC; she needs the pace on and then likes to run home. She ran fourth after pulling all the way and while sitting just behind the leader. CHIC will also run at Hawkesbury on the 7th/8, to turn the tables we trust.

AUSBRED LACE trialled very well at Hawkesbury on the 14th, she ran and excellent 3rd in top company and will trial again on Monday the 11th/8. She will then be nominated for Hawkesbury on the 21st in a 1300mt maiden.

BELLE RULER has completed her first month of slow work, Wade couldn't be happier with her; she has grown and strengthened considerably. BELLE will be looking for a trial at the end of August and is sure to have at least few starts this prep.
