An ingenious apparatus, made from a wheelie bin, filled with ice water, a hose, and a pump to regulate the flow of the lifesaving fluid, flows freely over post-race distressed horses.



VENCEDORA, seemed not perturbed by the heat and made the breeze for the rest of the field until caught over the final strides. He ran 4th, a number our horses seem to like? Many suitable races have been chosen for Veni, but today Wade is leaning towards Mudgee, BM-55 over 1400. If not it will be Orange on the 8th, BM-60 over 1600.




