We gave a disappointing sigh, we kicked the car tire, said a few cuss words, then moved on. Both horses are extremely well and owners will be informed when and where they will race again.

OUR ANNIVERSAIRE trialled the same day as Veni and with a touch of class she duly won. Annie will most probably race at Hawkesbury 9/4. Conformation will be sent to owners.

I'm on the final proof read for the publishers of 'For the Love of Patrick.' Fingers crossed it will be out in book form, no later than mid-June.

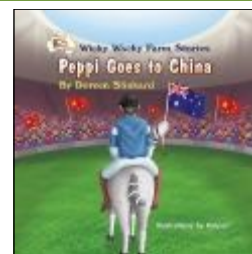
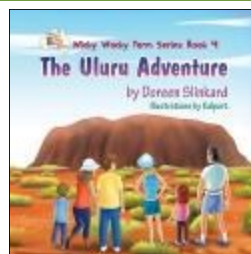
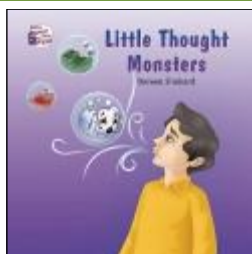
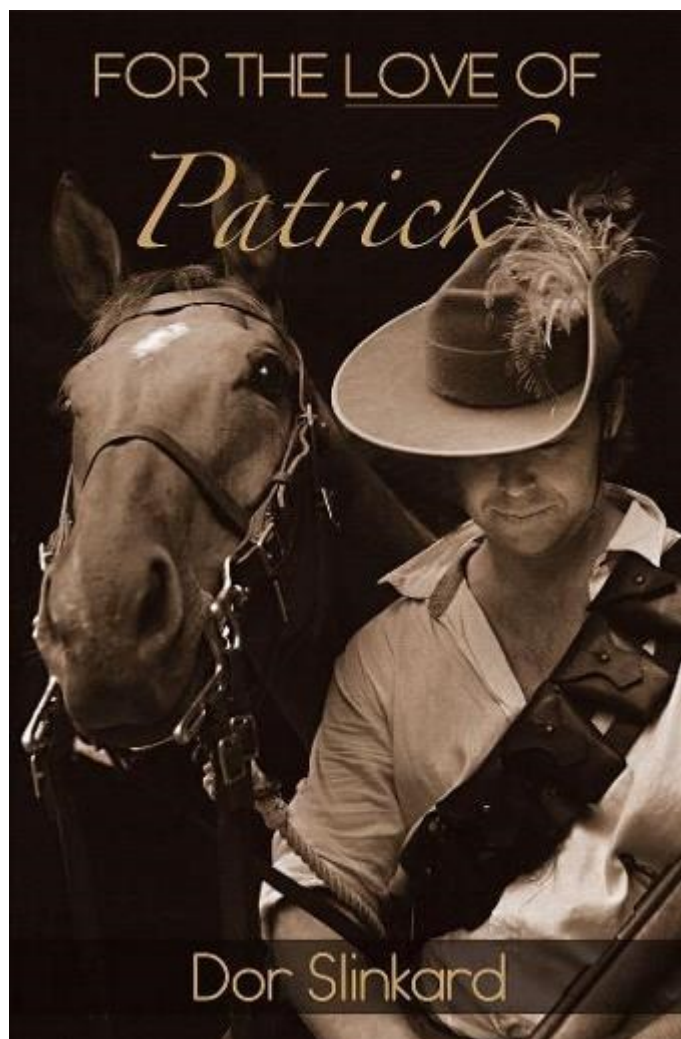

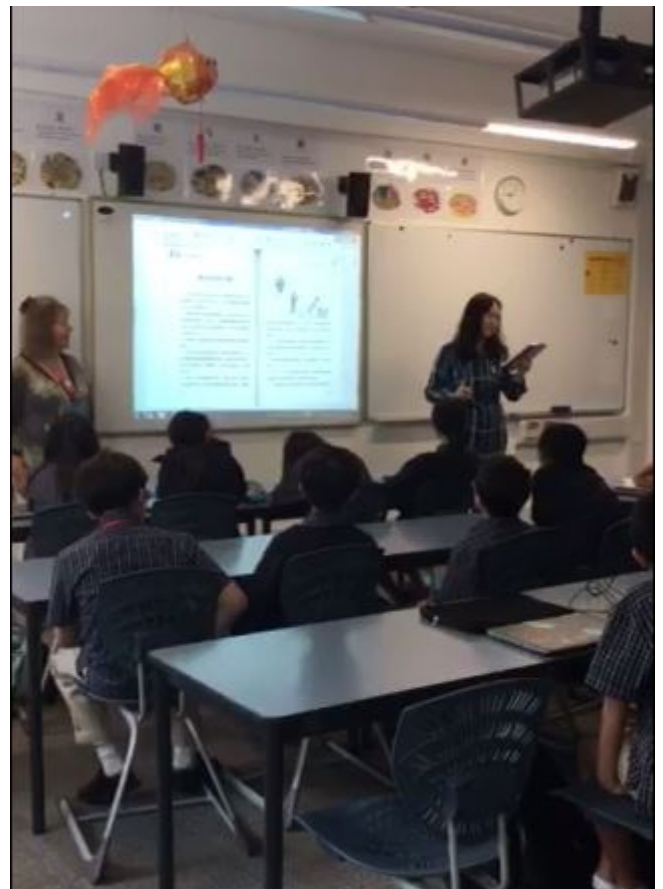
